

SQUARE KNOTS WORN BY VENTURERS

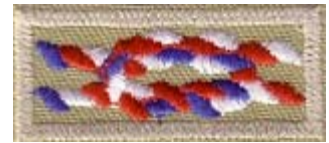
Amy DiFrancesco, 2005-06 National Venturing President, writes, "My other mom, Sharon Aycock, secretary to National Director of Venturing Division, Charles Holmes, prompted this resource with her gentle reminder that in Venturing, medals are typically worn only for formal events. Our Web Site team developed this list of square knots worn by Venturers."

"Generally, embroidered square knots are representative of pin-on medals or around-the-neck awards and are designed for the greater convenience of the wearer." *scouting.org*

Arrow of Light – The highest rank in Cub Scouting and the only Cub Scout badge that may be worn on the Boy Scout or Venturing uniform. When a Venturer turns 18, he can choose to wear the knot or continue to wear the Arrow of Light badge. Sometimes the wearing of this square knot is decided by the Crew.



Eagle – The highest rank for Boy Scouts. A male Venturer who has earned Eagle and earns the new Venturing Awards can wear his Eagle knot regardless of age.



Eagle and life member of NESE – This knot is worn in place of the Eagle square knot when the Venturer is a life member of the National Eagle Scout Association.



Honor Medal – A lifesaving award presented by the BSA National Court of Honor to a registered Scout or leader who has demonstrated unusual heroism in saving or attempting to save a life at extreme personal risk.



Hornaday Award – Conferred by the National Council available to recognize a Venturer for distinguished service in conservation.



James E. West – This award is given to individuals donating \$1,000 or more in cash or securities. Councils, districts, or other groups or individuals can bestow this honor on a Venturer by presenting him/her with a James E. West.



Leadership Award – Available to youth registered and involved in Venturing. The Venturing Leadership Award is presented by councils, areas, regions, and the BSA National Council to Venturers and adult volunteers who have made exceptional contributions to Venturing and who exemplify the Venturing Code and Oath. The Leadership Award Emblem Square Knot represents all levels.



Council: Blue and White Ribbon with Pendant

Area: Gray and White Ribbon with Pendant

Regional: Green and White Ribbon with Pendant

National: Red and White Ribbon with Pendant

Medal of Merit – Awarded by the National Court of Honor to a registered Scout or leader for meritorious action of an exceptional character, not necessarily involving risk to life.



OA Distinguished Service Award – Awarded by the National Order of the Arrow committee to those Arrowmen who have rendered outstanding service to the Order on a sectional, area, regional, or national basis.

Quartermaster – The highest rank in Sea Scouting



Silver Award & Summit Award – The highest award in Venturing, recognizing the high level of achievement of Venturers who acquire Venturing skills. When a Venturer earns Summit, the square knot would be worn when the young adult reached 21.
